Dear Parents,

It was lovely seeing many of you at Parents Evening this week for Years 1-6. I hope you all enjoyed meeting your child's teacher and seeing the excellent work they have been doing. You all should have received their Pupil Passport as well. Please speak to the class teacher is there are any problems.

Road Safety Week: The week beginning Monday 14th November, we will celebrate Road Safety Week here at school. The theme is 'Safe Roads for all'. The children will be doing lots of activities in class such as brightening a bag or scooter so it can be seen, practising to cross the road safely as well as singing some road safety songs. At home, we are also encouraging parent to send in photos of their child out and about crossing the road safely or using a sustainable mode of transport e.g. walking, cycling or riding a scooter. There will also be a mufti on Friday 18th November where the theme is 'Be Bright Be Seen'.

Online Safety and Parental Controls: The Ofcom report "Children and Parents: media use and attitudes 2022" found that 99% of children aged 3-17 in 2021 went online and the majority used a mobile phone (72%) or tablet (69%) to do so. The report also found that a quarter of all parents asked didn't use any parental controls at all on any of the devices their children use. At St Nicholas we would like to support you to keep your child safe online. A parent survey about what devices your children use is in the forms section of Weduc. Please complete this so that I can gain a better understanding of how to help. There will also be online safety information included in the school newsletters. However, in the meantime, I would like to signpost you to internetmatters.org where you can find step-by-step guides to setting up Parental Controls on popular devices, apps and broadband providers. You can also answer a few questions about your child's online activity and get a personalised toolkit for improving online safety in your home. If you need any further support with setting parental controls on your child's devices, please message Abbie McQueeney on WeDuc, or ask your child's class teacher to speak to me. Set your children's device up before you give it to them so you know they're safe online as soon as they start playing

Set parental controls on your broadband to prevent your children seeing things they shouldn't



For smart phones check parental controls are also set up on the mobile network

Set up the device safely



Use the device setting so you can only download age appropriate apps and games



Set up password control or disable in-app purchasing so big bills are not run up accidentally



Disable location services so your child doesn't unintentionally share their location with others



Download age appropriate apps you're happy for your child to use

Talk about staying safe
