Online Safety and Parental Controls: As we enter into the Christmas Period and the likelihood of children receiving a phone, tablet or games console, please bear in mind the following for support around e-safety. The Ofcom report "Children and Parents: media use and attitudes 2022" found that 99% of children aged 3-17 in 2021 went online and the majority used a mobile phone (72%) or tablet (69%) to do so. The report also found that a quarter of all parents asked didn't use any parental controls at all on any of the devices their children use. At St Nicholas we would like to support you to keep your child safe online. I would like to signpost you to internetmatters.org where you can find step-by-step guides to setting up Parental Controls on popular devices, apps and broadband providers. You can also answer a few questions about your child's online activity and get a personalised toolkit for improving online safety in your home.
