Dear Parents,

It has been a very chilly week this week and we are hoping the Spring and the warmer weather arrives soon. The children have continued to work hard in their classes. It has been lovely seeing the staff and children dress in purple today to remember Karl. All of us have such fond memories of him.

**Teachers Strike:** As you may be aware, the largest Teacher Union (the NEU) are due to lead their members in strike action on the following days: **Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> February, Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> March, Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> March** and **Thursday 16<sup>th</sup> March**. As of yet, I am not aware how many of the teaching staff this will involve so I am unsure how this will affect staffing on those days. I am hoping to have a decision made by next Friday 27<sup>th</sup> January – although some last minute decisions may need to be made. I will also send a further letter today explaining the strike action and decisions to be made.

Illness: We continue to have a lot of illness in school. Please do not send in your child if they have a respiratory infection, fever or stomach upsets including vomiting. New guidance was published at the beginning of January: Professor Susan Hopkins (Chief Medical Adviser at the UK Health Security Agency – UKHSA) has said 'It is important to minimise the spread of infection in schools and other education and childcare settings as much as possible. If your child is unwell and has a fever, they should stay home from school until the feel better and the fever has resolved.' In school, we have been continue to help the children learn about the importance of good hand hygiene and remembering to wash their hands with soap and warm water. We have also been reminding the children to catch coughs and sneezes in tissues then binning them.

**Reporting Absence:** Please remember that you can either report your child's absence via Weduc or you can leave a message on the telephone system. Please leave a reason for the absence so that we can mark it on the registers.

**GDPR form on Weduc:** Please can you complete the GDPR form on Weduc. This is where you give permission for your child's photo to be used in school, on our school website and on social media. Please can you complete this as soon as possible.

**Website:** Earlier this week, Abbie McQueeney (Teacher and ICT lead) put a message up on the Parents of St Nicholas Facebook group asking for suggestions of what you felt you would like to see on the parent support page on our school website. Please can you reply to this message or send Abbie a Weduc with your suggestions. We are re-vamping parts of our website and this would be really useful.

**Coffee Morning:** We had a great turnout at our 'Chill and Chat' Coffee Morning yesterday and both Juliet and Beth enjoyed talking to many of our parents. Our next coffee morning is on Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> January. It will be led by Melodie Blake and will focus on Writing and some of the resources/strategies we use.

**Clothing Bin:** As part of a recycling drive, the school now has a large clothing bin where parents and staff can dispose of any unwanted clothing items. More information will follow shortly.
