Dear Parents,

Sensory Week: October is Sensory Processing Awareness Month where the focus is on raising awareness of how sensory processing difficulties can make it challenging for children to engage and learn. Next week, we will have a sensory week in school. The children will do lots of sensory activities in school and teachers will be incorporating sensory activities into their planning. 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Parent Facebook Page: The Parents of St Nicholas Purley Facebook Page is a page that has been set up by parents as a support and information sharing network. Parents should not be using the page to raise concerns about a teacher or the school. In the first instance, you should be messaging your child's class teacher about any concerns. Staff are very good at informing the SLT when issues arise. If you feel it is necessary, you can also message a member of SLT for further support. If you feel that your concern has not been dealt with satisfactorily, you can then raise the concern with myself via the Complaints Policy (this is on the school website).

Parents should not be posting screenshots of Weduc messages they have received from a class teacher and should also not be naming the class teacher online. I have written a Parent Code of Conduct and updated the Home/School Agreement which will be taken to Governors at our next Governor meeting in October before I send out to parents.

In addition to this, if you speak to a teacher or a member of staff over the phone or face to face, please can we make sure that we are respectful to each other. In school, we teach and remind the children to 'Be Kind' and as adults we should be modelling this behaviour. I understand that as parents you have concerns, all that I ask is that you go through the correct channels to deal with them.

Thank you for your understanding.

World Teacher Day: Yesterday was World Teacher. Than you to those parents who messaged myself and their class teacher yesterday. I also just want to say how amazingly proud of I am of all the teaching staff who work at St Nicholas. We are very lucky to have dedicated, caring and hard-working teachers working for us.

Croydon SEND Strategy Launch: On Monday 9th October, Croydon LA will be launching their new SEND strategy for the next 3 years. The new strategy will turn the collective ambitions to improve service delivery and outcomes for all children and young people, with SEND or in alternative provision in Croydon, into a measurable reality that makes a lasting difference in their outcomes. Some of our year 6 children have been invited to attend the launch at Legacy and will showcase some of the work they have been doing since September.

Absence reporting: If your child is absent due to illness or for a medical appointment, please can you do this via Weduc or pressing 2 on the phone system and leave a message. Please give a specific reason for the absence so that we can mark it on the registers. We urge that rather than saying your child is 'unwell', you let us know the illness they have e.g. vomiting/diarrheoa/headache etc so that we can keep a track of illnesses in the school and if there are any contagious infections. In some cases, we need to alert the Public Health Agency. Please note that if you do not inform us of absence, it goes down as an 'N' code in the registers which is an unauthorised absence. Further, if your child is sick or un-well when they are in school, we will call parents to ask you to come and collect them immediately. Please make sure that we have the correct phone numbers for both contacts.

GDPR Form: Please can you make sure you complete the GDPR form on Weduc that gives permissions for photo use around school and on the school website. Please can you complete by Friday 3rd November.
